In closing court we learned of the victors, and were all made incredibly proud to hear our own Lord Robert Campbell declared victor of the ransom tourney, and called before the Baron and Baroness. The Mistress Cairistiona also spoke on behalf of Bordescros, extending invitation to all to Border War in February; we hope to see our friends there, old and new! We must also thank the Baron and Baroness of Stormhold, the event stewards, and all those gathered on the day for their kind hospitality.

lightly won!—we counted ourselves made far richer by our fights fought well and kind friends made.
