d. Marshal – Scott Murrowood/Robert Campbell

- * All is well
- * Two demonstrations this month so far, at Jindera there were 3 fighters and at Border Dimensions 6 fighters. We gained quite a bit of interest from both demos.
- * This extra interest means we need to look at updating group armour again.

- * Regarding Rapier and Safety, from the Earl Marshal:
- 1. Any rapier that includes two people in opposition must be in full gear, i.e. mask and punch tested garb; that does not include a class where the lecturer demonstrates thrusting etc against an imaginary opponent. If the lecturer or students aim toward each other, at any speed, full gear must be worn.
- 2. Rights of the people taking part in activities: anyone can call a HOLD if they feel something is unsafe; however, they do not have the right to impose their own standards of safety upon other participants. Marshals and fighters will discuss the issue and come to a consensus. If consensus cannot be reached, the Marshals who are present will make a decision and the event or activity may continue. If the person who called the hold is not satisfied that it is safe, they do not need to continue the activity. They are also required to report the incident to the Kingdom Marshal and copy in the Marshal-in-Charge of the event and the Group Marshal.

Also, Helen advises: Kingdom Rapier Marshal will discuss with Group Rapier Marshals and clarify training rules and update the handbook.

- * The Group Marshal's term is up. There has been one applicant, Tamsin Walle-Semmler (Mistress Thomasina). The two-week commentary period will commence from the advertisement.
- * Thank you to everyone who has helped over the last two years.

My deputy in the North reports that Tuesday night A&S has been concentrating on practicing eyelets and basket weaving. They plan to continue towards making drawstring bags. Also, on the cards in the near future, is coif making for loaner garb and soap making.

Ashlea has also been drawn to my attention for making a lovely tabard with Celtic Blackwork embroidery. Well done Ashlea.

With daylight savings now upon us there will A&S nights held at the Willis' and South's on a rotating basis. This will allow access to special equipment stored at these houses. The aim is to give the fighters some A&S time.

Mistress Thomasina is running regular A&S nights at her house on Thursday nights. Unfortunately, I don't have any more detail on this activity.

I would like to draw attention to Mistress Cairistiona who is spending her spare time making wall hangings for November Crown. I have seen some of her work, it is really good. They are all based on period pictures. For those of you who don't know this isn't the
